We are honoured to be joining with our indigenous brothers and sisters to build a 20-metre high Cross in the heart of our nation.

People are coming up with some great new ways of raising funds for the Cross and sharing with others why Jesus is the answer for our nation.

Here is one of the latest ideas that is about to be launched on the NSW Central Coast by Matt Coonan and his team.

Dance Day Central Coast

On Saturday 25 July 2015, Matt Coonan and his team are holding a dance day from 7am right through to 7pm.

Yes, that's right - 12 hours of dancing. Matt and anyone who is brave enough and fit enough to join him will be dancing for 12 hours straight. Their primary purpose is to highlight the importance of what Jesus did for us on the Cross.

And as they dance, they will also be raising money through donations to help build the cross in central Australia.

People who don't have the time or the energy to dance all day, can join in on Terrigal Hill (to the left of The Haven) from 5pm -7pm.

Matt and his team don't intend to do this only once. They plan to do it on the last Saturday of each month and taking it to other locations as well. Now that is commitment.

Already the local Christian radio station, Radio Rhema, is supporting this initiative. Just imagine what all the other people and media will think when they see these people (a real family event) all dancing with the joy of the Lord.

We believe without doubt that the vision our aboriginal family have to build a Cross in the heart of Australia is part of God's plan for revival in our nation. Our indigenous brothers and sisters also believe it will be a rallying point for the body of Christ to come together and lift up the

name of Jesus.

If I had all the money, I would simply pay for this Cross myself. But that is not what the Lord wants. God doesn't want just one person or small group to do this. He wants the body of believers to help raise up the Cross in the heart of our nation.
